Some questions might be kind of personal, but it says that everything I share will be kept private and I can skip any questions I don't want to answer.

It takes about 40 minutes and I'll get a \$20 gift card when I'm done.

I can do the survey online with a link or over the phone with someone from the study team.

It can even be completed by mail.

I'm going to do it.

It feels good to be a part of something that can make a difference.

Who knows?

Maybe my input can change things and help improve things for other autistic people.
