

**PS20-2010: Integrated HIV Programs for Health to Support Ending the HIV Epidemic in the United States**

**Component A FY 2020 Funding Ranges**

Anticipated Year 1 (FY 2020) funding ranges are listed by eligible jurisdiction in the table below. All amounts presented in the table are estimates based on current resources and are subject to change depending on the annual availability of funds. Funding is based on a data driven formula developed to better align funding with the ending the HIV epidemic initiative. This formula ensures that resources are distributed in a reliable manner, and that the federal investment in HIV prevention programs is based on need. Funding levels were determined by a formula reflecting a base funding amount, HIV disease prevalence, and number of counties within the health department jurisdiction (if applicable). Please note funding availability in subsequent fiscal years will be determined by satisfactory recipient performance, and a decision that continued funding is in the best interest of the Federal Government.
