<p>Prioritized HIV Testing</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Conduct HIV testing among priority populations • Provide optional services (e.g., Personalized Cognitive Counseling) <p>Status Neutral⁸ Comprehensive High Impact HIV Prevention (HIP) <i>Prevention & Essential Services</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Screen, provide, or refer clients to prevention and essential support services • Refer to or provide integrated STI and viral hepatitis screenings • Refer to or provide HIP behavioral interventions (Optional) • Offer condoms to ALL clients <p><i>Prevention Services for Persons regardless of HIV Status</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Screen, provide, or refer clients to antiretrovirals (ARVs) for HIV treatment or prevention (PrEP/nPEP) • Link clients to high quality medical services for HIV treatment or prevention • Link or re-engage clients out of HIV treatment or prevention care • Refer clients with HIV or qualifying STI to Partner Services • Provide/refer clients to appropriate medication adherence services • Offer or refer clients to comprehensive SSP (if indicated) <p>Collaborations, Promotion, and Recruitment</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Establish service agreements with medical care, prevention and essential support service providers • Conduct program promotion and outreach • Designate a safe space for priority populations • Address social determinants of health 	<p>Prioritized HIV Testing</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Increased HIV testing among priority populations • Increased HIV diagnoses among priority population clients unaware of their HIV status <p>Status Neutral Comprehensive HIP</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Increased access to prevention and essential support services • Increased receipt of integrated screenings • Increased access to condoms • Increased screenings, referrals, and linkage to PrEP and HIV treatment services • Increased linkage to HIV care among persons with newly diagnosed HIV ≤30 days • Increased re-engagement to HIV care among persons with previously diagnosed HIV, not in care ≤30 days • Increased access to Partner Services among persons with newly diagnosed HIV or qualifying STI • Increased access to appropriate medication adherence services <p>Collaborations, Promotion, and Recruitment</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Increased access to safe spaces among priority populations 	<p>Prioritized HIV Testing</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Increased knowledge of HIV status among priority populations <p>Status Neutral Comprehensive HIP</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Increased engagement in prevention and essential services • Increased use of condoms • Increased PrEP use • Increased viral suppression among persons with HIV <p>Collaboration, Promotion, and Recruitment</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Increased use of safe spaces among priority populations to address SDH-related barriers 	<p>Reduced HIV incidence among priority populations</p> <p>Reduced death rate among priority populations with diagnosed HIV infection</p> <p>Reduced HIV-related disparities in incidence, morbidity, and viral suppression among priority populations</p> <p>Improved health outcomes for ALL persons regardless of HIV status</p>
