Improving Birth Certificate Information

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Here are some approaches taken by Suburban hospital to improve reporting of birth certificate information.

Example Approaches to Improving Birth Certificate Data

- Established a multidisciplinary team to review records and identify challenges in reporting birth certificate information.
- Adopted use of resources, such as the Guide, to encourage adherence to birth certificate definitions.
 Modified their electronic medical records to capture information consistent with birth certificate items.
 Trained clinical staff to consistently document information
 - in specific locations in the medical records.
 - Identified the best sources and specific location in the
 - records and developed instructions for birth information specialists on reporting this information.
- Identified experts in their state vital records department to contact with questions.
 - Trained hospital staff on all of the new procedures.


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
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

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National Birth Certificate Data Items

- All states and independent vital statistics reporting areas collect the same medical and health information recommended on the <u>U.S. Standard</u> <u>Certificate of Live Birth.</u>
- While only selected items are featured in this training, ALL of the birth certificate items are of public health importance.
- Your state may also collect additional information of particular importance to your area. Please check with your vital statistics contact.



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Standard Resources to Support Data Collection Activities

- Since the inception of a national vital statistics system, states and the federal government have worked together to promote standards and consistency among state vital statistics systems as a means of promoting uniformity in the data collected.
- Medical and health information on your state's birth certificate and fetal death report conform to these national standards.
- Data collection procedures are also standardized to ensure we are all reporting the same information.

Two worksheets were developed to support quality data collection.

1. Facility Worksheet: This worksheet includes the medical and health information for the birth certificate. The information included on the facility worksheet should be collected from the medical records or from a clinician with direct knowledge of the mother and the delivery. This module covers birth certificate items collected in the facility.

2. Mother's worksheet: This worksheet includes the legal/civic and some health information for the birth certificate. It is completed by the mother. This module does not cover birth certificate items from the Mother's worksheet.

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The Guide

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The Guide to Completing the Facility Worksheets for the Certificate of Live Birth and Report of Fetal Death is the main resource for birth and fetal death medical and health information.

The medical and health information for the birth certificate should come from the medical records OR from a clinician with clinical knowledge of the mother, her delivery, or newborn.





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

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After obtaining the updated records, Mary sees that Ms. Wilson had a number of additional visits toward the end of her pregnancy, and developed high blood pressure, which ultimately resulted in pre-eclampsia. With the updated records, Mary enters "16" for the number of prenatal visits and she selects the pregnancy risk factor, hypertension during pregnancy.

Note: It is important to work with clinical and non-clinical staff at your facility and with prenatal care offices to ensure that updated records are used to complete the birth certificate. This scenario depicts how much this communication impacts the data.





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

Providing the Most Complete Information

Challenge 3

Medical and health items require that specific information is documented clearly and completely in the medical records.



Approaches to Improving Data Quality

- Review all records carefully as information may be available in different records or requires a more thorough review of the notes.
- Consult the clinician with knowledge of the mother and delivery to see whether they have the information.
- If information is incomplete,
- Do not estimate or guess a response.
- Do not ask the mother for the information.

Providing the Most Complete Information

Medical and health items require that specific information is documented clearly and completely in the medical records.

In particular, what should I do when date information is incomplete or only partially complete? <u>Select to</u> <u>learn more</u>.

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Approaches to Improving Data Quality

If date information is partially complete,

- Enter all parts of the date that are known.
- Enter unknown for any parts of the date that are missing. For example, if the day of the date of the first prenatal care visit is not available but the month and year are available, enter the month and year.

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

Reconciling Conflicting or Unclear Medical and Health Information

Challenge 4

There are a number of medical records that contain birth information. Sometimes the information is conflicting and unclear. For example, the prenatal care records indicate the mother had gestational diabetes, but the Labor and Delivery records indicates pre-pregnancy diabetes.

How do I ensure the most accurate information is recorded when information is conflicting or unclear in the medical records? Select to learn more.

Approaches to Improving Data Quality

- Communicate with clinical staff to identify the preferred medical record sources for the birth certificate items at your facility and where to find the information in those records.
- Refer to the Guide on preferred sources to assist in this process.
- Consult with a clinician with direct knowledge of the mother and delivery to determine the best response.

Knowledge Check 12

Sometimes information in the medical records is unclear or inconsistent making it difficult for the birth information specialist to know what to report on the birth certificate. For example, the obstetric estimate of gestational age (OE) in the labor and delivery records is 38 weeks and 6 days, but the newborn record states 39 weeks. Mary asks Anya for clarification.

Select here to read how Anya can assist Mary in reconciling this information. Anya reviews the records and confirms that the OE of gestational age was 38 weeks and 6 days. Based on The Guide, Mary knows that the OE must be <u>rounded down</u> for the birth certificate to reflect completed weeks of gestation, so she records 38 weeks for this item on the birth certificate.

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

Report of Fetal Death: Reporting Cause of Fetal Death

Challenge 5

Fetal deaths are rare events. Better information on the cause of fetal death can help us to prevent these tragic events in the future. While sometimes unknown, the cause of these deaths is a critical piece of information to identify why the death occurred and factors that might influence ways to prevent such losses.

How do I ensure the most accurate information is recorded for the cause of fetal death? <u>Select to learn more.</u> Only select "Next" after you have reviewed all 5 items.

Approaches to Improving Data Quality

- The attendant at delivery or the medical examiner/coroner is responsible for reporting cause of fetal death.
- Provide your best medical opinion in the cause-of-death section of the Report of Fetal Death
- The cause-of-death section has two parts. <u>Select to</u> view this section of the report.
- The cause of fetal death should reflect information from the autopsy or other types of postmortem examinations, if performed. <u>Select to learn more.</u>


