Please clarify the following:

- 1- If a drug that is not antineoplastic and fits NIOSH Criteria as a hazardous drug---(e.g. cordarone iv, depacone iv)--Do you have to prepare these meds in a biological safety cabinet?
- 2- What about oral meds that fit criteria as hazardous (e.g. Lunesta, Lyrica, Depakote , and hormonal drugs such as Arimedex, Tamoxifen----etc) do you have to handle with gloves or as long as there is no manipulation (e.g. crushing tablet) you can handle it as a regular tablet/Capsule?
- 3- When dispensing po meds (such as those mentioned in #2), do you have it put a sticker identifying drugs as "Hazardous"?
